
- Educate club members about competitive shooting sports

TERM	DEFINITION
Match	An event of competitive shooting made up of stages
Course of Fire or Stage	A design that defines the shooting challenge in terms of scoring method, targets, rounds, starts, and procedures
Walk-Through	Designated time to walk through and inspect the stage before you compete
Classification	Defines a competitor's performance and skill level - based on scores of classifier
Classifier	Specific stage designed as a standard test of skill used to determine a shooter's classification
Division	Defines the equipment and firearm used in a competition
Practiscore	Website where competitors sign up for matches and can view match results - https://practiscore.com/



# **Common rules**


## Cold Range

All firearms must be kept unloaded until a competitor is operating under the direction of the range officer

### Safe Table

Table area where guns must be check to make sure they are cleared and then holstered or cased – NO AMMO ALLOWED

### **180 Degree Rule**



The muzzle of your gun must always be pointed in a safe direction and therefore may never break the 180 degree plane AT ANY TIME to include moving, loading and reloading

### SAFETY is the biggest focus in competition shooting!

# Action Shooting Gear

- Handgun with multiple magazines (3 or more)
- Belt (depends on discipline)
- Holster (depends on discipline)
- Magazine pouches
